Honors/AP Course Offerings: Courses currently offered include: Honors History I, II; Honors English I, II; Honors Algebra I, Honors Geometry, Honors Pre-Calculus, Honors French, Honors German; AP U.S. History; AP European History; AP English Literature; AP English Language; AP Calculus AB, BC; AP Chemistry; AP Spanish; AP French; AP German.

Curricular Distinctives:

Covenant's History/English program has as its goal an intensive study of the great writings, ideas, peoples, and events that have formed and reformed Western Civilization. Normative works of our culture are studied within their historical settings. This helps students understand how the works and the people who wrote them were influenced by their times, and vice versa. Students also learn first hand the universal nature of the great works, which are classics precisely because they explore universal themes, thus speaking to all men at all times. The courses are organized chronologically, moving from ancient civilizations to modern times. Emphasis is placed upon reading, writing, and speaking skills. All English and most history courses are taught at the Honors or Advanced Placement level.

GPA Computation:

The GPA is determined by adding the grade points earned and dividing by the number of semester credits. This yields the GPA. *Please note the following:*

- GPA is computed on all courses with a numerical grade, grades 9-12.
- PAP denotes Pre-Advanced Placement course, AP denotes an Advanced Placement course; Honors denotes an Honors course. Semester grades in all **AP** classes are given an extra weighted grade of 0.75 due to the level of difficulty of these courses. Semester grades for all **honors** classes are given an extra weighted grade of 0.50. **PAP** courses are not weighted.
- For transfer students, only grades earned at Covenant are counted in GPA.

Covenant does *not* rank students due to the small size of the senior class.
